Goals and data-model

- Goals and uses:
 - Early modern readings and book culture (content)
 - History of reception
 - Disciplines (homiletics, history, etc.)
 - Stylistics and genres: aphorism, tacitism, etc.
- Data-model
 - Material/bibliographical description
 - Compiler, date and place of compilation
 - Methods: *adversaria (ordo rerum/verborum)/common place (ordo rerum/verborum)*
 - Length of the units: *lemma, adversaria, historia* (J. Drexel)
 - Content, quoted works, incipits
